

## **REPORT**

### **Interactive Meeting between the National Commissions for Women and Delhi Police**

**on**

**26<sup>th</sup> September, 2018**

**at**

**Conference Hall, Second Floor, National Commission for Women**

The National Commission for Women organized an interactive meeting with senior officials of Delhi Police on 26th September 2018 in the Conference Hall of the National Commission for Women at Jasola, New Delhi. The meeting was convened with a view to improving coordination between the National Commission for Women and Delhi Police, curbing crime against women and making Delhi a safe place for women.

3. The meeting was held in a very cordial manner and a number of issues were taken up for discussion. Delhi Police also shared information on the good practices being followed by them and also apprised about some of the new initiatives. The National Commission for Women and Delhi Police agreed on the following:-

- 1) The National Commission for Women will share all information related to complaints received and the Delhi Police will reciprocate by sending timely updates and expediting investigation. Delhi Police will appoint a nodal officer in every district for better coordination with the National Commission for Women.
- 2) The National Commission for Women and Delhi Police will collaborate and organize orientation programmes for women migrating to Delhi from the North East States for education with a view to help such women to adjust in the changed environment.
- 3) The National Commission for Women will organise Gender Sensitization Programmes for police personnel, judicial officers, doctors and forensic experts with a view to address certain misconceptions about provisions of laws and also impress upon them the need for prompt action in such cases.
- 4) Delhi Police informed about the process of registering Zero FIRs. It was informed that they are facilitating the process of registration of FIR in such cases by calling IO of concerned police station or escorting the complainant to the concerned police station when cases relate to Delhi. In cases where the complaints pertain to other states, it was apprised that Delhi Police registers Zero FIRs and transfers them to concerned police stations.
- 5) Delhi Police indicated that they would be able to conduct self-defense training programmes under the Sashakti initiative within 15 days of a request having been received from institutions. Delhi Police also indicated that the number of Sashakti

trainers would be increased and 2.25 lakh women will be trained in self-defence during the current year.

- 6) Delhi Police also informed that they will install 2,000 more CCTVs in addition to the 3,000 already in place across the capital. In addition, Delhi Police has operationalized a system for utilizing 1.5 lakh private CCTVs to gather evidence during investigation, if and when required.
- 7) Delhi Police will increase efforts to identify dark and vulnerable areas in the capital to curb crime against women.
- 8) More women will be recruited in Delhi Police force and the strength of women in Delhi Police will go up to 33% of the total strength by 2025.
- 9) Community Policing will be encouraged and new steps will be taken in it.
- 10) Efforts will be made to encourage people to help women in distress
- 11) Programmes will be conducted in schools and colleges to create awareness about measures taken by Delhi Police to ensure safety and security women in Delhi.
- 12) The National Commission for Women and Delhi Police will coordinate to make the working of Cyber Cells more effective for dealing with cyber crimes against women
- 13) The National Commission for Women and Delhi Police will organise awareness workshops to ensure safety and security of women from North East States in Delhi
- 14) The issuance of LoC and request for impounding/suspension of passports will be made in matrimonial issues related to NRI/Overseas marriages.
- 15) Better coordination will be established between Delhi Police, Protection Officers, District Legal Services Authority, State Run Shelter Homes and police in neighbouring States.
- 16) Quarterly interaction will be organised between Delhi Police and the National Commission for Women to review the measures taken to enhance safety and security of women in Delhi.

The meeting ended with a Vote of thanks to and from the Chair.
